Significance and Value to the Society: Hemorrhagic stroke is a devastating cerebral disease with still small visibility but of potential interests for both clinical and basic stroke researchers covering different fields of value for the ISCBFM and its members: from therapeutics, pre-clinical models, biomarkers, blood hemodynamics or imaging, among others.

The initiative of organizing this symposium arises from stroke clinicians and neuroscientists taking part of the Spanish network for research in stroke (named RICORS-ICTUS -https://ricors-ictus.es/-), a long-lasting cooperative network funded by the Spanish National Institute of Health for the last two decades. This network is currently composed by 23 stroke research groups and 15 associate clinical units working in several projects with research, educational and dissemination goals.

With this proposal we aim at internationalizing our education purposes by the hand of the ISCBFM by offering a focused small meeting to gather together internationally recognized scientists of the intracerebral hemorrhage field with young researchers and offer the opportunity to present current research works in a close and friendly environment. For 2024, our aim is to precede the annual RICORS-ICTUS meeting with the proposed international symposia on Intracerebral Hemorrhage.









Importantly, this meeting will be also an opportunity to introduce the ISCBFM to many Spanish neuroscientists with research interests within the scope of our Society and potentially attract new members since the number of Spanish representatives it is still low considering the large amount of research groups working in the field of cerebral disease, flow, metabolism, or imaging, among others.

In addition, we open the possibility of attending the annual meeting of the RICORS-ICTUS network that will take place the next day (English will be the official language), to all those attending the symposium who so choose it. In this meeting we will present the main research lines of the Spanish Stroke Network.

History of the conference/course: This symposium on intracerebral hemorrhage will be the first of its kind, although the RICORS-ICTUS network has long-lasting experience in organizing annual meetings with over 150 attendees and 2-days duration (most of them young researchers). More specifically, the previous two annual meetings of this stroke organization were organized by the applicant of this proposal (Dr. Lizasoain) in Madrid (2022 and 2023) combining invited presentations, oral abstracts and social events for networking. In this regard, a similar organization has been stablished for the current proposal but including the hemorrhage symposia as a specific and international course with open registrations.

Audience: This meeting clearly targets both clinical and basic neuroscientists with interests in the stroke field. Registration will be open thorough a registration portal and youngest researchers are called to present their investigations on cerebral hemorrhage in selected oral abstracts. We expect to attract the interest of those members of the RICORS-ICTUS network but also other neuroscientists around the world with interest in the stroke research field, specially from Europe due to the short length of the meeting format. English will be the official language of the meeting as well as of the meeting of the Spanish Stroke Network.

Faculty/Invited Speakers: An international programme has been designed to cover fundamental and state-of-the-art aspects of the intracerebral hemorrhage clinical management and research combined with time for oral presentations from meeting attendees (see the attached program). All proposed speakers (12) have been contacted and to the date we have positive confirmation to participate in this symposium of 11 of them as described in the attached agenda file. We have balanced the participation of both male/female speakers as well as the invitation of both senior and younger researchers from Spain, UK, France, Italy, Austria, Switzerland and the US. Finally, we will also invite members of the Spanish Stroke Network to participate as co-chairs of the planned sessions together with invited speakers to involve them in different sessions of the programme.









Agenda: The program has been designed in a **first day** to welcome both speakers and attendees in a starting afternoon session with a welcome reception and an overview talk on the state of the art in intracerebral hemorrhage. This will be followed by a **second full day** of invited talks combined with oral presentations from accepted abstracts. Talk topics have been selected for their importance in the stroke hemorrhage field and scientists with proved expertise have been contacted and invited to be part of this proposal (see the attached program).

To boost the interaction between invited speakers and attendees we have organized the symposium day in 4 blocks combining both types of presentations in each of them. Oral presentations (up to 12) will be selected by the programme committee from submitted abstracts to fit with the topic of the session and some of the speakers will serve as session chairs.

We offer the possibility of a **third day** of attendance to the meeting of the Spanish Stroke Network where the main lines of research that we carry out in this network will be outlined and collaborative results presented, with time for networking between attendees.

Venue: The meeting will take place at the Vall d'Hebron Hospital Campus. This is the largest and leading biomedical research hospital campus in Barcelona and a reference in Spain, its Research Institute (VHIR) it is supporting this application offering spaces and communication/ Dissemination support. The institution has a large conference room with an attached foyer for coffee and lunch breaks, all located in the teaching building of the Vall d'Hebron Campus in the city of Barcelona. The conference room has capacity for up to 300 attendees prepared with large screens and audio/video technical support. In a contiguous foyer coffee breaks and informal lunch will be served with the possibility to use outdoor spaces within the campus gardens in the same venue area. Catering companies under special agreements with the Vall d'Hebron Research Institute will be hired for in-site services. As mentioned, the Communication Department of the Vall d'Hebron Research Institute as well as the Spanish Stroke Network will support this event with advertising, in-site venue organization and live/post-meeting dissemination. The venue will be 15/20 minutes' walk from the accommodation hotel offered by the organization and just 5 minutes' walk from a public transportation metro station.

Budget Description including Co-fund:

We have established two registrations depending on the participation option. You can attend only the "Intracerebral hemorrhage Symposium" with a duration of 1 day and a half or you can attend both meetings ("Intracerebral hemorrhage Symposium" + "Spanish Stroke Network meeting") with a duration of 2 days and a half.

The total budget is shown in the attached table. The total expenses are 125350 euros (calculated for 150 attendees) which include accommodation, lunches, dinners, congress expenses, etc... The income is distributed as follows: 32000 euros provided by the Spanish Stroke Network, 68350 euros as registration fees, 2000 euros as a grant from the VHIR and 23000 euros as the amount requested from the ISCBFM, which corresponds to 18% of the total investment.









The grant requested from the ISCBFM (23000 euros) and 20000 euros from the Spanish Stroke Network, a total of 43000 euros (almost 35% of the total budget) will be dedicated to travel grants for young researchers.

Travel Bursaries: 2 types of travel bursaries will be established:

- 1. Grants for those who only want to attend the "Hemorrhage Symposium", which covers meeting registration, accommodation (2 nights hotel) and meals.
- 2. Grants for those who wish to attend the two meetings (Symposium on hemorrhage + meeting of the Spanish Stroke Network), which covers meeting registration, accommodation (3 nights hotel accommodation) and meals.

The total budget of these bursaries will be a total of 43000 euros: **23000 euros** provided by the **ISCBFM plus 20000 euros provided by** Spanish Stroke Network (RICORS-ICTUS).

We estimate that we will be able to give around 60 bursaries (40% of the total participants). The travel bursaries will be for those young researchers (graduate, PhD students or <5 years Phds, with corresponding accreditation). A specific call will be launched to evaluate travel bursary applications.

Registration Costs

To keep a close environment between meeting attendees, speakers, and organizers, we will have a registration rate including two- or three-nights' accommodation at Alimara Hotel and including all meals (breakfast, lunch and both welcome reception and gala dinner). As for the travel bursaries, we establish 2 types of registrations:

- a) Registration for the Intracerebral hemorrhage Symposium which covers accommodation (2 nights hotel accommodation) and meals. 600 euros total registration cost.
- b) Registration for both meetings (Intracerebral hemorrhage Symposium + Spanish Stroke Network meeting) which covers accommodation (3 nights hotel accommodation) and meals. 850 euros total registration cost.

Accommodation

The Meeting Organization together with the local help of the Vall d'Hebron Research Institute has already negotiated with Hotel Alimara to accommodate all conference attendees at a closed price. They have confirmed availability of double- or single-occupation rooms with breakfast included to accommodate up to 150 people. Hotel Alimara is located just 15/20 minutes' walk from the Meeting venue, and it also close to public transportation metro stations (2 minute), with a fast ride to Barcelona airport (30 minutes). Hotel Alimara has also offered the Gala dinner and welcome reception organization.
